The Helson Gallery is offering a five week workshop on Saturday afternoons on how to make altered books beginning on April 2, Saturday afternoons from 1 -5pm. in the studio of the Cultural Centre, 9 Church Street in downtown Georgetown

Led by noted altered book artist Supria Karmakar, students participants will learn mixed media and collage techniques to create unique, personalized works of book art. No previous art training is required. The registration fee of \$260 includes 25 hours of class-time and participants may wish to submit their creations for inclusion in a special exhibition of altered books to be held at the Helson Gallery this fall.
